Cotswold Archaeology has been working with developer Redcliff MCC LLP and Change Real Estate on the Redcliff Quarter Development from 2016 onwards. This is not the first time we have visited this site however, with our investigations beginning in 2006. Following an initial assessment of the site, we conducted a series of trial excavations between May 2007 and January 2008.

The site was very different back in 2007. As we had to work around the buildings within the site, our ten trenches were situated within the footprints of these structures. What we discovered on site is very similar to what is being recorded today, and included medieval hearths, drains, walls and floor surfaces.

As part of our investigations we also examined the buildings within the site. In 2007 and 2016, our buildings specialists visited the site in order to date the buildings and record any features of architectural interest. A photographic and written record was produced, some of which you can see within the exhibition today. These buildings have since been demolished, making way for the Redcliff Quarter Development.

In addition to the excavations undertaken as part of Phase 1, our heritage consultants considered whether development within the site would affect the surrounding Listed Buildings and Conservation Area.

All these investigations help build up a picture of what happened on the site over time.
