

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Risk Assessment

(To be implemented on all Cotswold Archaeology Fieldwork Projects)

This risk assessment is designed to identify and devise control measures for hazards and the risks posed to CA operatives, other operatives on site and the general public by Coronavirus (COVID-19). **It is the duty of all employees to notify the management of any deficiencies in this risk assessment, so that it can be revised accordingly.**

All risks have been given a risk rating of either high, medium or low. Once the controls have been implemented these risk rating will have been reduced down to an acceptable level.

Where there are additional hazards are that fall outside the controls in this risk assessment, the risk assessment can be revised and amended as necessary.

Any queries should, in the first instance, be notified to the Project Manager, H+S Coordinator or the H+S Officer who will endeavour to resolve any immediate concerns. Please refer to the CA Safety, Health and Environment Management System (2021) for guidance on general policy and CA Health and Safety Safe Systems of Work (2021).

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The following information and matrix should be used to judge the levels of risk. The risk control measures when implemented must reduce the residual risk down to an acceptable level. Where this cannot be achieved a Point of Work risk assessment must be carried out where further controls can be introduced i.e. permit to work, safe system of work to ensure all risks are suitably managed.

RISK MATRIX

RISK RATING **H = HIGH** **M = MEDIUM** **L = LOW**

HAZARD = Potential to cause harm

RISK = Probability of that harm occurring

The risk rating criteria is detailed below:

HIGH: A hazard that has the potential to cause a fatal or major injury

MEDIUM: A hazard resulting in a lost time injury

LOW: A hazard resulting in first aid but not lost time

Staff must be seated at least 1m apart and where possible face away from each other unless they are within a domestic bubble. Vehicles to be regularly cleaned inside, washing hands before and after use, with open windows where possible, using the vehicles mechanical ventilation (not recycling within cab functions), and the same people vehicle sharing on a regular basis. Face coverings will be mandatory while sharing vehicles.</p> <p>Larger parking areas to be provided where possible.</p> <p>Provide hand cleaning facilities for arrival on site.</p>

When not seated or consuming food all staff and visitors must wear face coverings within all site welfare units and all CA offices. In addition to this staff seated within 2m of each other must ensure other mitigations are in place such as extra ventilation, screens, not directly facing each other and face coverings.			X

PL/PM and/or SPOC (Alli Preece) must be contacted, and steps will be taken to evacuate the individual from site. In addition to self-isolating the operative must ensure they do not touch anything. They must cough or sneeze into a tissue or the crook of their arm and dispose of all soiled tissues in a bin. If possible, the individual should leave site. If it is possible that other staff have been exposed, then the site may have to be closed. Staff who present symptoms or fear they may have been exposed to Coronavirus must not attend work and must comply with the current medical advice issued by the Government/Public Health England.
